
THE BEGINNING OF THE METIS

THE METIS PEOPLE

- When the fur trade came to the west of Canada a new group of people were born.
- British and Francophone traders married women from different First Nations groups.

• The children of these families would marry one another and eventually a new nation was

formed - the Metis nation.

METIS

Metis were descended from British or Francophone traders and First Nations.

- Some of their ways of life came from these roots but the Metis developed their own unique culture.
- Why do you think they would have their own unique culture that is different from other First Nations, British, and Francophone culture?

HOW DID THE METIS HELP THE FUR TRADE?

- How do you think the Metis may have helped the fur trade?
- Being people who came from multiple cultures (British or French and First Nations) what advantages or benefits would they have over others?
- Many Metis people could speak multiple languages English, French, First Nations (Cree, Blackfoot).

PROVIDED GOODS FOR THE FUR TRADE

- Metis hunted buffalo and used them to create many goods for fur traders. This included:
 - Buffalo tongues for eating
 - Robes made from buffalo pelts
 - Pemmican
 - Dried, pounded meat mixed with hot buffalo grease and dried berries.
 - · Pemmican would become very hard and never went bad.
 - It was extremely nutritious.



YORK BOATS

- As time went on, fur traders were finding that their loads were getting bigger and heavier and canoes were too small and light to carry them.
- The Metis solved this problem by inventing the York boat.
- York boats could carry twice as much cargo as canoes and 6 to 8 crewmen.
- They were 8.5 meters long, had flat bottoms, and were made of spruce planking.

RED RIVER CARTS

- Another invention by the Metis.
- It was made without any metal. It was made all out of wood.
- It was horse drawn.
- It could carry more cargo than the boats.
- The wheels could be removed by taking the pegs out when they had to travel the river.





METIS SETTLEMENT

- At first, many Metis spent most of their time on trade routes.
- Eventually many started to settle in one place.
- Some lived near fur-trading forts.
- Others began to farm for part of the year and hunt buffalo for another part.
- With this, Metis communities started to develop.
- Today, Alberta is the only province in Canada with official Metis settlements.
